## Saxilby Footbridge is Back!

As was mentioned in last month's magazine, we were eagerly awaiting the return of the footbridge, following it's full refurbishment over the last few months.

The bridge was finally returned to it's rightful place at the waterfront on Tuesday, 28 November, following a final weather related delay.

Following years of lobbying, the bridge was removed in July, and has been shot blasted, strengthened and repainted and looks spectacular in the winter sun.

The bridge refurbishment forms a central

part of the Saxilby Waterfront Regeneration project, a parish council priority project, following the area being placed on Historic England's 'at risk register'.

The parish council would like to thank West Lindsey District

Council (WLDC) and their team for leading on and funding the bridge refurbishment project.

Following it's reinstallation, the bridge was informally reopened by WLDC Chief Executive Ian Knowles on Tuesday, 12 December.

Parish council Chair Elizabeth Hillman said "It's great to have the footbridge back and looking in such good condition following it's refurbishment.

The parish council have lobbied for this refurbishment for six years as part of the regeneration of Saxilby Waterfront, it's wonderful to see that work coming to fruition.

Thank you to WLDC for all their work on this project, their project team have been a pleasure to work with."

More work will be carried out by Lincolnshire County Council on the steps and ramps up to the bridge in the spring. Following this, the parish council will hold a full, formal reopening ceremony for the whole community to be involved in.

#### Saxilby with Ingleby Neighbourhood Development Plan update



Saxilby with Ingleby Neighbourhood Plan (NDP) was made in 2017.

With changes in legislation and the need for new policies to reflect the changing needs of the parish, it is time to update our NDP.

We have now received government funding of £7,500 to refresh our plan along with technical support for a new Housing Need Assessment and Design Codes (Character Assessment).

The community planning benefits which an NDP can bring to a parish area are wide-ranging.

The process allows local people to contribute to protecting cherished areas and shaping and influencing development in their parish. Importantly, neighbourhood plans are legal documents which form part of the development plan and influence planning application decisions.

Further benefits of neighbourhood plans include being able to:

- Allocate new housing sites including for affordable housing
- Identify development limit boundaries
- Preserve the character of the parish and its historic features
- Influence the appearance of new development by design codes
- Protect green spaces, important views, and community facilities
- Designate new open spaces
- Save trees, woodlands, and hedges
- Enhance wildlife areas

Promote new footpaths, cycle routes, and green corridors



• Include design requirements for new buildings that mitigate against climate change.

#### **Community Resilience**

Met Office's weather app to your smart phone, you can then set up alerts direct to your phone for when weather warnings are issued.



These alerts and warnings will

give you all the information you'll need to know about the weather that is incoming.

You can also check out the Met Office's five tips for staying safe in different types of weather, just search for 'Met Office five tips' on google and different weather related tips will pop up for you to look at.

In the event of flooding, you should focus on the safety of yourself and your family.

#### Are hedgehogs hibernating now?

Hibernation generally starts from anywhere from late Oct-Dec and is influenced by the outside temperature.



Due to the very warm weather in October, hibernation is likely to be delayed as a result. Please do your bit by ensuring they aren't dis-

turbed in your garden and have lots of natural food available (avoid chemicals and incorporate wild areas of your garden).
