

## Saxilby & District Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) update



We're really pleased to announce that planning permission for a new fence around the soor to be refur-

bished MUGA has been granted by West Lindsey District Council.

The granting of planning permission represents a milestone moment for this priority project for the council and puts the project in a position to move forward.

The MUGA working group have worked tirelessly alongside councillors and council staff to move this project forward and the council thanks them for their efforts in getting the project to this important stage.

A tender document regarding the refurbishment of the site and installation of fencing is currently being put together to move the project forward further.

As more updates come in on this project we'll keep you updated across our social media channels and in this magazine.

The MUGA project is funded by S106 monies from the Ingleby View site, grant funding from WLDC, funding from Lincolnshire Co-op and doesn't draw on the council precept.

## **Speedwatch Successes**


Our Speedwatch team have been out with the local policing team, working together to help reduce speeding on Mill Lane.

A number of drivers were caught going over 40mph along Mill Lane. The drivers were all spoken to on the spot by the policing team or will have received a visit from the police One driver was even served with two on the





mission for a spot penalties, one for gonew fence ing over 40mph in a 30mph zone and another penalty for not wearing a seat belt, which is part of Lincolnshire Police's #fatalfive initiative. The police team also set up a camera on High Street and caught a number of drivers doing over 40mph all of whom will receive a visit from the police.



## Footbridge refurb update

Members of the parish council's planning committee accompanied District Councillor Paul Lee and other

West Lindsey
District Council (WLDC) officials on a visit to the company who are refurbishing the footbridge on Tuesday, 7

November.



The refurbishment has been progressing well, following the release of more funds for the project by WLDC after initial inspections showed more work was required than previously anticipated.

The central span of the bridge has been fully shot-blasted, repaired, and repainted and now



awaits the installation of its new walkway.

Meanwhile the two end sections have been blasted and repaired and were due to be painted.

The bridge was due to return to it's rightful place on Thursday, 23 November, however due to high winds this was postponed to Tuesday,

28 November, so as this magazine went to print we were eagerly awaiting its return.

Did you know hedgehogs are classed as vulnerable to extinction in Great Britain?

Did you know there is estimated to be less than one million hedgehogs left in the wild?

difference and become a hedgehog champion! We're aiming to make Saxilby a hedgehog friendly parish and we're delighted to have teamed up with a local vet to make this project a reality.

number of gardens overnight ensures they can eat enough food during their active season and ensure good weight gain before hibernating. The best way to allow for constant access is by using a hedgehog highway! This entails having a 13cm X 13cm or 5 X 5" hole in walls or fences to allow hedgehogs to come and go as they please.

We'd like to take this opportunity to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year from all of us at the parish council.


