Current provision is being maintained in the draft budget excluding provision of contracting services for grass cutting and grounds maintenance for the school and recreation ground. This does not affect those characteristics protected by the Equality Act – the land is not owned by the council.

REPORT

The draft budget has been set to broadly maintain staffing and service provision.

Last year council tax did not increase per household in the parish.

Changes at a national level are impacting on the council, with the pressure of inflation and increased staffing costs as a result of NJC pay increases and NWL increases. This is placing significant pressure on the council's budget.

In order to maintain the current staffing and comparable service provision the draft budget is based on a 5% (band D) council tax increase.

The budget does not include income for school grounds maintenance or recreation ground maintenance (football and cricket). The reasoning behind this is that no longer undertaking these contracts would free up the limited grounds resource for the upkeep and maintenance of the council's own assets and liabilities, and reduce workload demands on staff accordingly.

The budget does not include provision for council led community events.

The budget includes an increased community grants pot.

Where budget lines have been updated from the draft budget shared at 23-12 Full Council, these items have been highlighted in blue to assist councillors.
