Lincoln Cycle Path Connection

We are delighted that the groundwork has begun by contractors of Lincolnshire County Council on the cycle path connection between the A57 and Sellars Walk. This will complete the long-awaited cycle path connection into the village.

This project is in the Neighbourhood Development Plan. The clerk, on behalf of the council, has worked relentlessly for over four years to ensure the project came into fruition.

The cycle path is expected to be completed in four to six weeks.

The parish council has been making improvements to the St Andrews Community Centre to reduce its carbon footprint—in-line with its sustainability objective

Last year, all remaining windows in the building were replaced with double glazed units.

The roof space has been insulated to minimise the loss of heat, and the phased upgrade to LED lighting throughout the building continues.

This month a number of the old fire doors within the building are being replaced as the old doors have come to the end of their life and are no longer compliant with fire regulations. The new doors will also improve accessibility to the building as they have a wider door and hold back devices.

Official Opening of Saxilby Footbridge

Thursday 25 April saw the official reopening of Saxilby Waterfront Footbridge, following its full refurbishment in late 2023.

The opening was attended by around 40 people including residents, Saxilby Waterfront Working Group members, West Lindsey District Council (WLDC), the Canal and River Trust, local organisations, and parish councillors.

Councillor Hillman, chair of the parish council, took the opportunity to thank West Lindsey District Council for listening to the community and committing to refurbish the footbridge. Councillor Hillman also outlined the significance of the event in relation to the ongoing Waterfront Regeneration project, and announced that as a result of the efforts of the working group and volunteers, Bridge Street Conservation Area has been removed from Historic England's Heritage At Risk Register

and had been re-classified as vulnerable.

Following speeches, the bridge was officially reopened by former district and parish councillor David Cotton and the family of former district councillor Bob Ballerini, who worked so hard to bring the bridge to the village originally.

The bridge looks spectacular following its refurbishment and is now a real asset to the village.

The parish council would like to thank WLDC for refurbishing the footbridge.
