Leasing of St Andrews Community Centre— Update

Community Consultation

The closing date for the community consultation regarding the council leasing St Andrews Community Centre is Sunday 3 November.

What happens then?

Councillors will use the results of the community consultation, along with other supporting documents to vote on whether to proceed with a long-term formal lease for the community centre and if so undertake negotiations with Saxilby Recreation Ground Charity.

Anything else?

In the meantime, other parts of the recreation ground project continue moving forward including progressing the 'outdoor' lease for the play area, wheeled (skate) park, and Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA). This means the council will continue to manage and maintain these areas for the enjoyment and benefit of residents and visitors.

The draft lease is currently being reviewed and when this is agreed and a lease is in place (subject to Charity Commission consent), the council will be able to progress the MUGA refurbishment project which already has planning approval.

The development of the draft tender is beginning in the meantime, to facilitate continued movement on the project.

Depending on the tender amounts some final fundraising/grants may be required, before the work can finally be commissioned for this community project which has been sought for many years.



Neighbourhood Plan Review

When you read this, the final public consultation will have taken place at Saxilby Village Hall on Tue 29 October.

At the consultation residents could view the draft plan and share any final comments and suggestions, prior to the plan being finalised and progressing onto the next stage of its journey.

The next stages before adoption are an independent examination and then finally a referendum where residents can vote on whether to adopt the plan.

If adopted, it will then be used as a formal planning document by West Lindsey District Council, alongside the local plan and national planning policy, to determine planning applications in our parish.

Community Shoal Art Project

Health & Wellbeing: Cycle Path Connection

On Saturday 26 October the cycle path connection between Sellars Walk and the A57 was officially opened. This connection was originally in developers plans when the Daubeney estate was built a number of years ago, but was not brought forward and completed.

The project was included in the 2017 Neighbourhood Plan. In 2019 the county council agreed to undertake the project.

The £100,000 project was started and completed five years later by the county council in 2024, following continued lobbying by the parish council.

The council is delighted that Saxilby is now connected to Lincoln by a continuous cycle way, supporting residents well-being, sustainable travel, tourism, and supporting the local economy. Thank you Lincolnshire County Council.
