## Review decision to erect fencing on Bridge Place Corner

#### **REPORT**

Bridge Place Corner, a grassed area at the junction of Bridge Street and Bridge Place, is maintained by the parish council, volunteers, and local residents.

A previous decision was made to install post and wire fencing along the boundary adjacent to the access path serving an upstairs flat at the Sun Inn, to protect a newly planted hedge.

Installation work commenced but was paused following concerns raised by the landlord of the adjacent property. The landlord indicated that the fencing would restrict access to the flat, particularly for moving furniture and conducting improvement works.

The hedge in question has now matured and established itself. Consequently, it is considered that the original rationale for the fence is no longer valid, and its installation is not necessary.
