a. Agree to consult on a proposed change of use for Saxilby Waterfront Facilities Shower Room to a heritage room

Having been proposed (Cllr J Willox) and seconded (Cllr Barratt) it was resolved to: Agree to consult on a proposed change of use for Saxilby Waterfront Facilities from a boater shower room to a heritage room

Objectives:

- To inform residents about the proposed conversion of the boaters' facilities
- To gather resident feedback on the proposal
- To ensure transparency and community involvement in the decision-making process
- To assess the level of public support or concern regarding the change of use

Key messages:

- The proposal aims to enhance community space by creating a heritage room celebrating the village's history. This aligns with the community projects identified in the 2017 NDP, and the reviewed 2025 NDP, which are based on resident feedback and consultation.
- A usage survey for the boater's facilities (shower and sluice room) indicates limited need for these facilities. Alternative facilities are available at both Lincoln and Torksey.
- Resident input is vital to shape how the space is used and to ensure it meets community interests.
