I. Purpose of the Report

To seek retrospective formal approval for the Parish Council hosting the annual Macmillan Coffee Morning and associated purchase of cakes (£12.50).

2. Background

The Parish Council has supported the Macmillan Coffee Morning for a number of years as part of its community engagement activities. The event provides an opportunity for residents, staff, and councillors to come together to raise funds for Macmillan Cancer Support.

This year's event was held in-line with previous years but was inadvertently omitted from the events calendar for formal approval.

3. Financial Implications

A total of £12.50 was spent on cakes for the event, due to a shortage of donated cakes. There is sufficient funding within the events budget to cover this cost.

4. Community Benefit

The event supports the Council's community engagement objectives by bringing people together in a friendly and inclusive setting while raising money for a well-recognised national charity.
