COMMUNITY MOSAIC RESTORATION

A much-loved mosaic created by local school children in 2012 to mark the Queen's Golden Jubilee will soon return to public display in the village centre.

After being removed from the flood wall due to weather damage, the mosaic has been carefully restored by volunteers. It will now be installed on a purpose-built brick plinth on the High Street, outside Lincolnshire Co-op Pharmacy by Cliff Williams and Sons.


- 100 Standard engineering charcoal grey bricks

WESTCROFT GREEN SPACE CONSULTATION

The seven-week public consultation on the future of Westcroft Green Space has now closed, with 468 responses received through surveys, events and community displays. Engagement was particularly strong from children and families.

The findings show that Westcroft is a valued green space with significant untapped potential. While around half of respondents already use the site regularly, many said they would visit more often if improvements were made. Responses showed a preference for a low-impact, natural design, combining play opportunities with calmer, nature-led areas, while preserving the character of the space.



Key priorities included improved play provision and balancing the needs of different users. Overall, there was strong support for a carefully zoned approach separating the active and relaxation elements. The council will now use the findings to develop a detailed project brief and look for further funding.

MUGA

The parish council continues to make progress on the re-development of the Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA), a project aimed at improving local sports and recreation facilities for the community. The project is scheduled to move into the build phase in the spring/summer, subject to the final FCC funding agreement being issued and signed.



Current costings, including a contingency, show that the project is fully funded in principle, with a significant grant allocated by FCC alongside existing council funds. This funding is subject to final checks and formal approval. The next steps will focus on putting the build contract in place and confirming remaining details such as security and access arrangements.

The council is excited to keep residents updated as this long-awaited project nears starting.
