Installation of New Waste Bin

SUMMARY:

A resident has contacted the council and would like to sponsor the installation of a litter bin. A suitable location has been identified at the end of the footpath connecting Mill Lane to the Saxilby Public Recreation Ground, near the rear of the school.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

That the Planning and Development Committee:

- I. Approves the installation of a new litter bin by the footpath between Mill Lane and the Saxilby Public Recreation Ground, near the rear of the school, if funded by the resident.

Public Sector Equality Duty

The installation of an additional litter bin is expected to have a positive impact by helping to maintain a cleaner and more accessible public footpath for all users, including older people, disabled residents, families with children and other users with protected characteristics. No adverse equality impacts have been identified. The bin will be installed near the path to promote accessibility.

Duty to conserve and enhance biodiversity

The proposal is not expected to have any negative impact on biodiversity. By encouraging the proper disposal of litter, the bin may help reduce waste in adjacent green spaces and contribute to a cleaner environment for local wildlife.

Consideration on carbon reduction:

The installation will have a negligible impact on carbon emissions. The bin will be incorporated into the council's existing waste collection route past this location, so no further vehicle movements are anticipated.

Impact on staff

There will be a small amount of officer time required to place the order, and coordinate installation. Ongoing maintenance and emptying will be undertaken by the council under the existing service level agreement, resulting in minimal impact on parish staff resources.

Installation of Waste Bin

Report Summary

A resident has approached the Parish Council with an offer to fully fund the purchase and installation of a new litter bin as a birthday gift for a family member who regularly undertakes litter picking in the village.

Following discussions with the resident, a suitable location has been identified on the end of the footpath connecting Mill Lane to the Saxilby Public Recreation Ground, near the rear of the school and the start of the field. This location is well used by pedestrians and would benefit from additional litter provision.

The Chair of the Saxilby Public Recreation Ground Charity (SPRGC), which owns the land, has confirmed support for the proposal.

Proposed Delivery Arrangement

The proposed arrangement follows the Council's usual process for bin installations:

1. The resident pays the full cost of the bin and installation.
2. The Parish Council places the order with West Lindsey District Council.
3. West Lindsey District Council installs the bin.
4. The new bin is added to the Parish Council's existing cleansing service level agreement with West Lindsey District Council for routine emptying.

Financial Implications

Cost

There is no net capital cost to the Parish Council, as the resident will reimburse the full purchase and installation cost of a hooded black post mounted litter bin. The resident has confirmed their wish to proceed and understands that payment will be required in advance.

The only ongoing cost will be the routine emptying of the bin, which will be incorporated into the Council's existing service agreement with West Lindsey District Council.

Plaque

The resident has asked whether a small commemorative plaque can be attached to the bin. Subject to Committee approval, the resident will provide proposed wording and the Clerk will liaise with the Grounds Manager regarding the most appropriate method of fixing the plaque without damaging the bin.
