

## **Saxilby with Ingleby Annual Parish Meeting 2026**

### **Annual Report: Anglian Water**

#### **Saxilby Water Recycling Centre**

As you know, there are times when we find there are higher than normal levels of ammonia in either the wastewater coming into site or in what we've cleaned ready to put into the watercourse. As a result, there have been periods where we've had to introduce tankering to protect the local environment.

We previously updated the Parish Council about our plans to install three HSAF treatment units at the site to provide resilience to ammonia spikes during periods of colder weather. Work has been progressing on this, and whilst it has taken longer than originally anticipated, we're pleased to report that all three units have now been fitted and two out of the three have seeded successfully (i.e. bacteria has grown on the media necessary for removing ammonia at the required levels). The third tank is in its seeding period, and we are currently sampling to determine the levels of ammonia removal. Once the seeding has been successfully completed, we will be able to complete the necessary pipework upgrades on site and decommission the SAF treatment unit which will stop the resonating noise from the site.

As mentioned in previous correspondence, we would be happy to invite the Parish Council to visit the site when this work has been completed and apologise for the delay in being able to organise this.

#### **Water Recycling Sewer Network**

The 7" rising main on West Bank has now been partially re-lined and we are currently awaiting confirmation of funding for the remaining relining work to be completed. There was a burst on the rising main on 30<sup>th</sup> March due to a slipped coupling and this was repaired and reinstated.

We did also experience some external sewer flooding during the winter months within the catchment. This was predominantly caused by surface water overloading the sewer network and we are actively carrying out investigations within the catchment to identify the root causes.

#### **West Bank**

We have recently repaired the tarmac on part of West Bank and would like to thank residents for bearing with us whilst we completed this work.
