SUMMARY:

The Council has received two grant applications from community organisations operating within the parish requesting a contribution towards the running cost of **insurance**:

1. Saxilby with Ingleby Good Neighbour Scheme (SIGNS) – request for financial support towards continuation of volunteer-led community support services
2. St Andrew's Indoor Bowls Club – request for financial support towards ongoing delivery of indoor recreational bowling activities

Both organisations provide demonstrable community benefit through the promotion of wellbeing, social inclusion, and access to local activities.

Both organisations currently have some reserves.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

1. Agree a grant of £150 to Saxilby with Ingleby Good Neighbour Scheme (SIGNS) towards continuation of volunteer-led community support services – insurance
2. Agree a grant of £150 St Andrew's Indoor Bowls Club – request for financial support towards ongoing delivery of indoor recreational bowling activities – insurance

Note: The above recommendations are subject to council agreeing to allocate general reserves to the grants budget for 2026/27.

Both grant recipients provide services which are accessible to residents and support social inclusion, particularly for older residents and those at risk of isolation.

REPORT

The Council has received two applications for financial assistance from community organisations operating within the parish. Both applications are presented for councillor consideration in line with the council’s objectives of supporting community wellbeing, local facilities, and community engagement.

1. Saxilby with Ingleby Good Neighbour Scheme (SIGNS)

- Volunteer-led community support service operating within the parish
- Provides practical and social support to residents, including:
 - Social visits
 - Transport support
 - Assistance for isolated or vulnerable residents
 - Supports reduction of social isolation and improves wellbeing
- Funding requested towards ongoing operational costs, namely insurance

2. St Andrew’s Indoor Bowls Club

Provides indoor recreational bowling and associated social activities

- Encourages:
 - Physical activity
 - Social interaction and cohesion
 - Participation, particularly among older residents
 - Contributes to overall community wellbeing through structured leisure provision
- Funding requested towards ongoing operational costs, namely insurance

General considerations

- Both organisations provide direct benefit to parish residents
- Each contributes to Council objectives relating to:
 - Community wellbeing
 - Support for local facilities and services
 - Encouragement of participation and engagement
- Members are asked to consider the applications in line with the Council’s statutory powers and available budgets
- Both organisations currently have surplus reserves
