

Regeneration of Bridge Street Conservation Area (BSCA) Update for Full Council Wednesday 2nd February 2022

Community Vision: 'Bridge Street Conservation Area will be a vibrant, well maintained place to live, work and visit. Its historic character, architectural heritage and waterway will be celebrated, preserved and enhanced.'

- Saxilby Waterfront Festival Task and Finish Group. We now have two main sponsors but are still looking for sponsors to cover this event. A road closure is a priority, and a verbal update may be given at council. (See attached Task and Finish Group notes)
 - Events for the summer: Following a meeting with CRT there will be some paddle boat sessions and 'go wild' nature themed activities over the spring and summer.
- **Project Plan Phase Four:** There is a project plan for this year (see attachment)
- Funding Opportunity: There is a possibility that funding might be available as part of the Queens Platinum Jubilee celebrations. This would fund the refurbishment of the mosaic (project plan attached) and the agreed artwork of a shoal of stainless-steel fish for the apex of the footbridge.
 - **To agree** for the Working Group to apply for funding for the refurbishment of the mosaic and the fish artwork for the footbridge.
- **Replacement Street name Signs:** A request has been made for replacing street name signs in the Conservation Area.
 - **To agree** for funding from the budget to pay for new street name signs in the Conservation Area which includes the logo.
- **Volunteer days:** These will resume in March and will be renamed Saxilby Waterfront Volunteer Days.
