Saxilby Waterfront Festival Task and Finish Group: Please see update.

Funding: A funding application has been submitted for Art Council funding as agreed at full council for the mosaic and shoal of fish.

Volunteer days: These will resume in March and renamed Saxilby Waterfront Volunteer Days. Councillors and their families are invited to join us as the regeneration of bridge Street Conservation Area is a priority project for the council.

Donation: A resident has donated £1000 to cover the cost of the memory branch.

Noticeboard: The new noticeboard will be officially unveiled with everyone who donated to it attending. We are looking at Saturday 2nd April which is a volunteer day, this will be confirmed.

Wildflowers and planting: We have had a quote for wildflower planting the rest of the top towpath from the Conservation Volunteers. **ACTION - FULL COUNCIL TO APPROVE**

Community Wildlife Funding: We are eligible to apply for this funding as it is two years since our last application. To agree for the Working Group to apply for funding towards wildflower planting.
