Saxilby with Ingleby Neighbourhood Development Plan Update Can you help?

The 2011 Localism Act introduced Neighbourhood Planning which has been an influential piece of legislation giving communities the power to shape their future.

In 2017, the Saxilby with Ingleby Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) was 'made', and became one of the most important documents in the parish council's history. It has been used since 2017 by West Lindsey District Council in their planning decisions, and by our own council planning committee to support planning consultee responses.

The plan was overseen by a steering group consisting of parish councillors and residents.

To ensure the plan was community led, a questionnaire was sent to every household, and several public consultation events were held. After two years the consultation concluded with a referendum which ratified the plan and allowed it to be 'made'.

The plan not only sets out where development will take place in the parish, but also protects our heritage, our environment, improving transport links and retaining the character of the area.

45 projects were listed in the plan to deliver the aspirations of the local community, all identified through the consultation undertaken in the production of the neighbourhood plan. **19 projects have now been completed with a further seven in the process of being completed**.

Five years on the NDP now needs updating and with the draft Lincolnshire Local Plan proposing 151 new dwellings for Saxilby, the community needs to have a say where this housing will go. We also need to refresh some of our policies such as biodiversity and climate change and reconsult with an ever-expanding parish.

We are looking for members of the community to help with updating the plan. No experience is necessary, and the group will be working alongside a planner who will be funded by Locality funding. If you are new to the village or a resident who has lived here a long time you are welcome to get involved.
