Resignation of Cllr Cotton as Chair of the Council.

Following February's full council meeting, Cllr David Cotton announced his resignation from the position of chair of the council, ahead of planned surgery which took place in February.

His resignation marked the end of his third term as chair of the council and the elections in May will see the end of Cllr Cotton's time on the council after almost 40 years. He will also be stepping down from his role as a West Lindsey District Councillor.

Voter ID requirement

From 4 May 2023, voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections.

This will apply to:

- Local elections
- Police and Crime commissioner elections
- UK Parliamentary by-elections
- Recall Petitions

From October 2023 this will also apply to UK general elections.

If you don't have photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a Voter Authority Certificate.
