Initiate Four Year Plan 2023-27

A four year plan will be developed for the council to

- Agree vision, objectives and priorities
- Identify baseline figures to monitor against
- Determine performance indicators to monitor and measure performance for service areas and objectives to drive delivery

YEAR 1:

Priority Projects 2023/2024

- 1. Saxilby Waterfront Public Facilities Refurbishment (NDP project)
- 2. MUGA Refurbishment (NDP project)
- 3. Bus Shelter Programme Queensway bus shelter (NDP project)
- 4. NDP review (NDP project)
- 5. Refurbish ladies toilets at community centre

Net Zero Actions

- 1. Insulate the loft at the community centre
- 2. Replace wooden windows at community centre to double/triple glazed

- 1. Waterfront Festival
- 2. Remembrance
- 3. Christmas Lights Switch-On TBC

YEAR 2:

Priority Projects 2024/25

- 1. Westcroft green space project (NDP project)
- 2. Bus Shelter Programme Co-op bus shelter (NDP project)
- 3. Support tennis club project to re-surface four courts and replace fencing
- 4. Refurbish function room in the community hub

Net Zero Actions

- 1. Investigate installing solar panels at the community hub and install if feasible
- 2. Install 1-2 vehicle charging points at the community hub

- 2. Remembrance Event

YEAR 3:

Priority Projects 2025/26

- 1. Mill Lane Changing Rooms Refurbishment including solar panels
- 2. Bus Shelter Programme Mill Lane bus shelter (for bus stop with no shelter)

- 4. Clerk to further develop four year 'business' plan and PI's and bring draft back in Aug

Existing Council Objectives

Community View

Big Community Consultation

- Strong support for council objectives
- •Strong support for grounds maintenance. Bin emptying, litter picking, bins/dog bins, grass cutting, and maintenance of trees most highly rated
- The provision of benches and bus shelters less important
- •Community centre supported as community hub, with room hire and library provision important
- •60% felt the provision of changing rooms and a (family friendly) bar was important
- Library opening 12-15 hours per week, with volunteers present
- •Most important event Christmas lights switch on and fireworks display' 84% said very/important. 56% would be prepared to pay for the event
