New Community Centre Windows MUGA/basketball cou

We're really pleased to have had new windows installed at the St Andrews Community Centre.

The old wooden framed windows had reached the end of their life being draughty and very poor on energy efficiency, so the new, PVCu ones should keep the building warmer in winter for those using the building and reduce energy bills too!

New windows have been installed in the changing rooms, changing room toilets, meeting room, upstairs toilets, council office and the old youth club room.

The new windows look so much smarter than the old ones and match the ones at the southern end of the building, giving the whole building an improved more uniform look.

This cost was funded from a pot ear marked for community centre improvements and not from precept (council tax)



Saxilby & District Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) update

We're really pleased to announce that between this magazine going to print and you getting to read it, a planning application will have been submitted to West Lindsey, which comprises of an application for new fencing around the old





Ground. Should this application be approved, the site will then be resurfaced, with a new fence installed and this will become Saxilby's new and improved MUGA.

While the planning application process is ongoing, a specification for the refurbishment of the site and fencing will be developed, and a surface type will be decided on.

We're really excited to see this project progressing and a huge amount of credit has to go to the small but dedicated MUGA Working Group who are driving this project forward.

Neighourhood Development Plan **Update**

The NDP update project continues to work away in the background.

The project has recently been offered £7,475 of external locality funding to help progress the project during 2023-24.

The project has been assigned a Locality Design Code Team member who will facilitate a new character assessment for the village, which will reflect the changes to the village over the past few years. An up to date housing needs assessment has also been requested.

Saxilby Waterfront Public Facilities Refurbishment Survey. The facilities include: public toilets, boaters shower room, and boaters sluice (waste) facilities.

As the regeneration of the Conservation Area continues the next project is to shower the public facilities with some long overdue TLC! This supports the council's objectives of improving community facilities, reducing our carbon footprint, preserving heritage assets, and encouraging business and tourism opportunities.




Saxilby Waterfront Festival


