REPORT

As the recreation ground project continues, the project is now considering assets on the field.

One of the assets which currently sits on the council's asset register are football goals situated on the field.

Currently a $16' \times 7'$ set of goals and a $24' \times 8'$ set of goals are shown as being located on the recreation ground on the council's asset register. These would appear to be the 'fixed goals' on the larger pitches.

The council no longer manages the recreation ground, although it currently provides grass cutting and line marking services.

Football goals are associated with one group within the community and the council supports participatory engagement and groups being pro-active in their own determination.

Based on the above it would make sense for the club to have ownership of the football goals which they use on a weekly basis, rather than the council, which is a separate organisation and no longer manages the site.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

That Full Council notes the report and agrees to offer gifting the football goals on the recreation ground to Saxilby AFC.
