Community Speed Watch

- Speeding is a common cause for concern around the parish, being raised in the Big Community Survey and by residents at council meetings.
- Setting up a community speed watch has facilitated and empowered residents to work with the police to address the issue in a tangible way.

Update:

- The council have bought several 30MPH signs which have been put up on Mill Lane.
- The speed watch group is going well. We have recently done some work with the local police and their fatal four campaign.



- As a result of Working with the local police we have managed to establish a new position on Mill Lane where the volunteers feel safer and happier working from. This is at the entrance of the Mill Lane workshop.
- We are doing periodic checks on Mill Lane when availability suits. Although we have the new yellow 30MPH signs up, we are still finding that some people are still speeding with speeds of 35-39 MPH been recorded regularly.
- A further 12, 40 MPH signs have been purchased and erected on the A57 to try to make drivers aware of the speed limit. One resident has reported that he feels these signs have already made a difference.
- 30 MPH Bin stickers have been purchased. Residents on Mill Lane spoken to and stickers given to everyone on Mill Lane who wanted one.
